Employment of Clients - The story of Andrews and his family



Andrews has been visiting CMHP on and off for a year - his attendance has been a little erratic in spite of support from his wife and family, including his two young sons. Some time back he was admitted to the inpatient facility at CMHP at the request of his wife. Unfortunately he did not want to stay and discharged himself to be found by his family at the Dargah in Nemeli. The Banyan representatives contacted him here and persuaded him that cooperation and consistent medical treatment would improve his life, outlook and relations with his family. Andrews found the prospect of returning to work and the level of independence he had before his condition deteriorated very motivating.

After some initial shadowing of Banyan staff, in which he participated wholeheartedly, Andrews was offered a job working in a Toll Booth. His illness is such that he found the busy traffic distressing and even after some counselling he was unable to continue with this employment.

Undeterred, further assessments were done and another job as a Security Guard for a school was secured. This has been a huge success with the whole family now supported by the connections this job has facilitated including accommodation, a salary of Rs. 4000 per month and a role for his wife where she can still look after their young son as well.

Previously non-compliant with medication, Andrews now comes to CMHP himself to collect his prescription. He has stopped drinking alcohol and his demeanour and behaviour is much improved leaving him a happy and supportive father and husband to his family.

BANYAN ACADEMY OF LEADERSHIP in MENTAL HEALTH—BALM

Highlights:

- The **Impact Assessment** that was initiated in May was finalised in June and has been submitted to the Sir Ratan Tata Trust.
- On 8th and 9th of June, BALM has organised a **training for The Banyan staff** on the Indian Disability and Evaluation Assessment Scale (IDEAS) and the Positive and Negative Symptoms Scale (PANSS), which are standard tools to assess disability and severity of illness. The training was given by Dr. K.V. Kishore of NIMHANS and was very much appreciated by the staff.
- **Research** is ongoing for the four study projects:
 - The impact of the Disability Allowance of The Banyan on 're-integrated clients' and their families in and around Chennai.
 - 'Interlinkages between mental health and employment: A case study of socioeconomically disadvantaged Banyan Outpatient clients'.
 - Self Help Groups as a form of rehabilitation
 - Data has been collected for the '**Study of rehabilitated ex-residents of The Banyan in South India**' in June in Kerala and Andhra Pradesh and is ongoing in Tamil Nadu. Social workers and volunteers have painstakingly travelled to Kerala, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu to find rehabilitated residents and administer questionnaires. The data collected till now will be analysed in July.
- **Rangoonwala Foundation India Trust (RFIT)** paid a visit to Adaikalam and the Protected Community in Kovalam to gather information for the proposal that has been submitted. RFIT staff has had discussions with The Banyan team on future funding.
- Preparation and admissions have started for the 3rd UCL - BALM course on 'Recent Advances in Cultural Psychiatry for South Asia'. The course will be held from 9 - 11 November 2009. For more information on the course, please contact Mirjam at mirjam.d@thebanyan.org.

Hao, from the US has continued her time as a volunteer in June by accompanying a social worker on the trip to collect data for the study on rehabilitated residents. She has also been a great help in compiling the Human Rights Cell booklet and in updating the transit care manual.

Anne-Sophie, a psychology student from France has lived in Adaikalam since April and is enjoying her stay there. She has helped the Adaikalam team in documenting the different processes within Adaikalam as well as organising presentations for the staff on subjects related to psychology.

A special mention should be made of **Mr. David Leake** of Zurich Financial Services, who visited The Banyan for one week to help us improve our Branding Strategy. David visited all the projects and presented his findings at the end of the week. David's insights were very useful and his suggestions have been taken up for implementation. He will continue to engage with The Banyan online, so we look forward to continue working with him.
